Grass Cutting and Grounds Maintenance:

Despite the challenges of new working practices, flooding, drought and COVID-19 restrictions we strive to maintain the high standards expected of us.

We re-appointed Ian Rumney of Solway Garden & Landscapes as our grounds maintenance contractor and he, together with his team, work hard to keep the grass under control, cut the hedges, prune bushes, trim trees, edge the paths, and restore old grave levels etc.

Tivoli are contracted to provide gravedigging services and problems can sometimes arise with new graves sinking because of differing soil conditions and the weather. We do appreciate this can result in an unsightly initial finish to grave spaces but Tivoli re-attend on request to make good.

We aim to always treat Cemetery Users courteously and expect you to treat our on-site staff, volunteers, contractors, and committee members in a similarly respectful way and would ask you not to resort to any form of personal abuse.
